Sub: Bulk drug unit by M/s Mahima Exports Pvt Limited at B.S.T Road, Tehsil Ganuar in district Sonapat in Haryana

Sir,

This has reference to your letter No. nil dated 2nd August, 2005 on the above subject seeking environmental clearance from the Ministry along with project documents including EIA /EMP and questionnaire and subsequent clarification/additional information furnished vide your letter dated 16th November, 2005 on the above mentioned subject.

The Ministry of Environment and Forests has examined your application. It is noted that proposal involves manufacturing of following bulk drugs with total capacity of 2701 TPA. Land area of the project is 0.15 ha. The project does not involve forest land and displacement of people. Water requirement of 1.5m³/d of would be met from the ground water source. ETP and process sludge would be stored in the sludge storage yard within the plant premises. It is also noted that NOC from Haryana State Pollution Control Board has been obtained on 2.6.2003. Public hearing panel has considered the project in the meeting held on 25.4.2005 . Total cost of the project is Rs.40 lakhs.

2.0. The Ministry of Environment and Forests hereby accords environmental clearance to the above project under the provisions of EIA Notification dated 27th January, 1994 as amended subsequently subject to strict compliance of the following specific and general conditions:

A. SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

- i. The gaseous emissions (SO₂, NO_x and HCl) and particulate matters, from various process units shall conform to the standards prescribed by the concerned authorities from time to time. At no time, the emission levels should go beyond the stipulated standards. In the event of failure of pollution control system(s) adopted by the unit, the respective unit should not be restarted until the control measures are rectified to achieve the desired efficiency.


- ii. Fugitive emission in the work zone environment, product, raw material storage areas must be regularly monitored. The process emissions shall be scrubbed with scrubber and scrubbed emissions shall be sent to ETP for treatment.
- iii. As reflected in the EIA /EMP report, the effluent generation shall not increase 500 litre/day. The effluent after primary and secondary treatment shall be discharged into public sewer. The effluent quality shall meet the standards stipulated by Pollution Control Board/ EPA Rules.
- iv. The ETP sludge after drying on the sludge drying beds shall be collected in the double lined polyethene bags and disposed off in the HDPE lined landfill facility within the plant premises. The leachates from the landfill shall be recycled back to the ETP.
- v. The ground water quality around the hazardous waste disposal facility shall be regularly monitored and data recorded to ensure there is no contamination of ground water.
- vi. Company shall adopt rainwater harvesting measures to recharge the ground water.
- vii. Green belt of adequate width and density in 25% of plant area shall be provided to mitigate the effects of fugitive emission all around the plant. The development of green belt along the boundary walls, open space and avenue roads shall be in consultation with the local DFO as per CPCB guidelines.
- viii. The Company shall undertake eco-development measures including community welfare measures in the project area for the overall improvement of the environment. The eco-development plan shall be submitted to the HSPCB within three months of receipt of this letter for approval.

B. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- i. The project authorities must strictly adhere to the stipulations made by the Haryana State Pollution Control Board.
- ii. No further expansion or modifications in the plant shall be carried out without prior approval of the Ministry of Environment & Forests. In case of deviations or alterations in the project proposal from those submitted to this Ministry for clearance, a fresh reference should be made to the Ministry to assess the adequacy of conditions imposed and to add additional environmental protection measures required, if any.

- iii. The project authorities must strictly comply with the rules and regulations with regard to handling and disposal of hazardous wastes in accordance with the Hazardous Wastes (Management and Handling) Rules, 2003. Authorization from the State Pollution Control Board must be obtained for collections/treatment/storage/disposal of hazardous wastes.
- iv. The overall noise levels in and around the plant area should be kept well within the standards (85 dBA) by providing noise control measures including acoustic hoods, silencers, enclosures etc. on all sources of noise generation. The ambient noise levels shall conform to the standards prescribed under EPA Rules, 1989 viz. 75 dBA (day time) and 70 (dBA (night time).
- v. Occupational health surveillance programme should be undertaken as regular exercise for all the employees, specifically for those engaged in handling hazardous substances. The first aid facilities in the occupational health centre should be strengthened and the medical records of each employees should be maintained separately.
- vi. The project proponent shall also comply with all the environmental protection measures and safeguards recommended in the EIA and Risk analysis report.
- vii. A separate Environmental Management Cell equipped with full fledged laboratory facilities must be set up to carry out the Environmental Management and monitoring functions.
- viii. The project authorities will provide adequate funds both recurring and non-recurring to implement the conditions stipulated by the Ministry of Environment & Forests as well as the State Government along with the implementation schedule for all the conditions stipulated herein. The funds so provided shall not be diverted for any other purpose.
- ix. The implementation of the project vis-à-vis environmental action plans will be monitored by Ministry's regional office at Chandigarh/State Pollution Control Board /Central Pollution Control Board. A six monthly compliance status report should be submitted to monitoring agencies.
- x. The Project Proponent should inform the public that the project has been accorded environmental clearance by the Ministry and copies of the clearance letter are available with the State Pollution Control Board/ Committee and may also be seen at Website of the Ministry of Environment and Forests at <http://envfor.nic.in>. This should be advertised within seven days from the date of issue of the clearance letter, at least in two local newspapers that are widely circulated in the region of which one shall be in the vernacular language of the locality concerned and a copy of the same shall be forwarded to the Regional office.

- xi. The Project Authorities should inform the Regional Office as well as the Ministry, the date of financial closure and final approval of the project by the concerned authorities and the date of commencing the land development work, if any.
- 3.0. The Ministry may revoke or suspend the clearance, if implementation of any of the above conditions is not satisfactory.
- 4.0. The Ministry reserves the right to stipulate additional conditions if found necessary. The Company in a time bound manner will implement these conditions.
- 5.0. The above conditions will be enforced, inter-alia under the provisions of the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, Hazardous Waste(Management & Handling) Rules, 2003 and the Public Liability Insurance Act, 1991 along with their amendments and rules
